The programme initiated with a welcome address by Sri B. N. Rajeshwar, Secretary, Osmania Graduates Association, and Hyderabad. Workshop coordinator Dr. K. V. Achalapathi was introduced by Hon. Secretary Sri B. N. Rajeshwar. Prof. K. Krishna Chaitanya addressed the audience and discussed the changes and effects after COVID-19. He also explained various practices followed by colleges for project guidance and stressed that the standards are to be improved for better academics and performances. Prof. M. ## Department of chemistry

### Workshop on “Spectral Analysis in Structure Determination Of Organic Molecules

The Department of chemistry in association with Royal Society of Chemistry (UK)-Local Section Deccan, India, conducted two days’ workshop on “Spectral Analysis in Structure Determination of Organic Molecules” on 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> July, 2024 to impart a sound knowledge and provide practical experience in spectral interpretation. The program was initiated with a prayer song followed by lighting of lamp by the dignitaries on the dais. Hon. Secretary Sri. B. Surender Reddy Garu, Principal Dr. N. Hemalatha, vice-principal Dr. Amaranatha Sarma, convener Prof. V Peesapati (RSC) and co-convener Dr. T. D. Neelima and the main speakers Prof. P S N Reddy (OU), Dr. R Srinivas (IICT-H), and Prof. P N Sarma (OU). The main objective of this workshop is to provide the teaching faculty and students with a unique opportunity to get trained in interpretation of spectral data from expert speakers and best practices in challenging subject areas. This workshop focused on four main topics UV, IR NMR, Mass spectrometry. The technical session on the first day commenced with a lecture by Prof. P S N Reddy on <sup>1</sup>H NMR Spectroscopy and its applications. The lecture was followed on Mass spectrometry and it’s applications by Dr.R Srinivas. In the afternoon session, Prof. PN Sarma gave a lecture on Application of UV and IR spectroscopy in structure determination. On the following day, the technical session started with a demonstration on “Spectrometric Identification of organic compounds by UV, IR, NMR and mass spectroscopy “by Prof. V Peesapati & Prof. P N Sarma, which was followed by problem solving by the participants. The post lunch session comprised of a written quiz. This intensive workshop gave the participants a valuable opportunity to gain a firm theoretical basis and obtain practical experience in the analysis and interpretation of the aforementioned spectroscopic data. The participants had an opportunity to interact with the speakers to clarify their doubts on the key aspects of this important field. The demonstration, problem-solving session and the quiz conducted which was followed by a presentation on IR spectroscopy by Prof. NV Sastry (Retd. Prof Sardar Patel University, Gujarat). The valedictory session was graced by various dignitaries from RSC community that included Dr. Venkataramana, Dr. Raju. Dr. Narendra kumar Talluri (Hon.Secretary, RSC-LSD), Dr. N.V Sastry (Retd. Prof Sardar Patel University, Gujarat) etc. Four students were selected based on their performance and they awarded prizes by Prof. PN Sarma and Dr. Narendra Kumar Talluri. The participants expressed that the demonstration, problem solving and quest sessions were thought provoking and fun-filled too. They were delighted with the physical arrangements including the food served at the workshop and also expressed their eagerness to attend more such workshops in future.





## Expert Lecture on NMR Spectroscopy and its Applications

The department of chemistry organized an extension lecture by Dr. Shankaraiah, professor of Chemistry (NIPER Hyderabad), on the topic "NMR Spectroscopy and its Applications" on 17th August, 2024 at 10.30am. The programme was attended by the Post graduate Chemistry students of first, second year and B.Sc. final year students. Professor briefed the history of NMR and explained how work in NMR evolved and he also focused on instrumentation of NMR, number of signals, their multiplicities, factors influencing the chemical shift values in proton NMR in detail. The students interacted and solved few questions based on identification of different types of protons and the expected signals for those molecules. A Brief overview on  $^{13}\text{C}$  NMR and 2D NMR was given the professor in order to gain in-depth knowledge and to up skill them. He also pointed out how this subject started with physics and now at present finds its hold in medical field as well. Professor highlighted about the usefulness of NMR by showing Nobel Laureates not only from field of chemistry but also from other disciplines.

## Department of Physical Science

Department of physical science attended one day faculty workshop on 'Material Sciences' organized by Osmania Graduates Association on 20th July, 2024 at Golden jubilee hall, exhibition grounds, Osmania University. The workshop comprised of three lectures on computer science, mathematics and NEP. Prof. G. Prasad's (Department of Physics) focused on the integration of computational science with physics and he is also covered fundamental concepts and practical applications of computational methods in solving complex physical problems. The key topics discussed in the session were role computational methods in computational physics, applications of computational science in various fields of physics, simulators, software tools and programming languages used in computational science that can be applied in other fields. He emphasized more

on how simulators could help in learning and doing abstract things. He underlined that simulation tools and coding programs etc. could be the areas of concern for future generations. The follow-up lecture was given by Prof. Surender Reddy from Department of Mathematics on group theory that included finite and infinite groups, symmetry groups enabled us to realize the relevance of group theory in explaining symmetry in physical systems and helped us know about the application of group theory concepts to solve mathematical and scientific problems and understand the use of mathematics in E-commerce. The concluding session by Prof. Shivraj, Department of Chemistry, OU stressed on Quality education-Quality teachers-perspectives from NEP-2020. The lecture highlighted the reforms proposed by NEP 2020 to enhance the educational system in India and the main aims of National education policy (NEP) is to encourage and promote creativity, innovation, leadership qualities, research ability, values and good attitudes, social exposure, physical education, pedagogy and its role in evolving experiential learning in education with conceptual clarity through field visits, promoting learning activities and making it more discussion based. We look forward to attend more such workshops in the future, with lectures on nanomaterial's, advancements in nanotechnology, their role in sustainability etc which are more pertinent to the theme of the workshop and the present day scenario.



## Department of Hindi

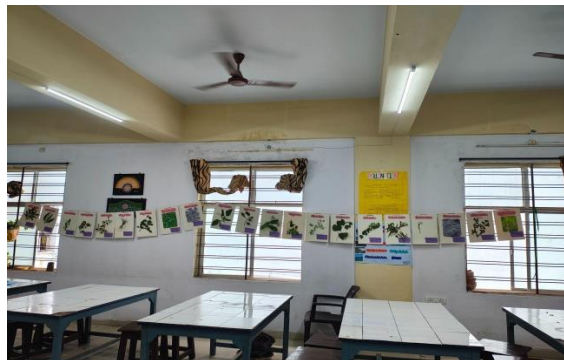

## Orientation Program for Life Sciences Faculty

Organized by the Osmania Graduates Association on 27th July, 2024, at the Golden Jubilee Block, Exhibition Grounds, and Hyderabad. The main objective of the programme is to enlighten the faculty about various aspects and trends in Life Sciences. The event commenced with a warm welcome address by OGA President, Prof. T.V. Gopala Chary followed by an enlightening talk on “Essential lab techniques” by Dr. K. Ramakrishna. The List of the Speakers included Dr. K. Ramakrishna Garu, Director of the Centre for Plant Molecular Biology (CPMB) at Osmania University, Prof. Manohara Chaari Professor, Emeritus, Dept. of Botany, UCS, OU, Dr. Hameeda Begum Professor, Dept. of Life Sciences and DR. C. Srinivasulu M.Sc., Ph.D., FLS, FZS Professor of Zoology.

**Session: 1** - The chief guest, Dr. K. Ramakrishna Garu, Director of the Centre for Plant Molecular Biology (CPMB) at Osmania University delivered a compelling inaugural lecture on “Up skilling Life Science Faculty – Essential Lab Techniques for Biomedical Research.” He meticulously covered advanced techniques across several domains like Biochemistry: Protein isolation and separation, western blotting, Immunoprecipitation and Cell Biology: Cell culture, cell survival assays, Immunofluorescence.

**Session: 2** - Prof. Manohara Chaari who is a retired botany professor at Osmania university gave an intriguing talk on “Biology to Biotechnology,” emphasizing the crucial role of microorganisms in maintaining the stability of the ecosystem. He also mentioned about diversified forms of fungal species like *Taxomyces* associated with higher plants which help in extraction of taxol from *Taxus brevifolia* which works wonders for treating Cancer. The importance of mushrooms, role of Lichens their association and colonization, medicinal properties of various plants, microorganisms and plants that are used in biotechnology was also mentioned.

**Session: 3** - Dr. Hameeda Begum shared her expertise on “Understanding the Microbial World – Metagenomics,” where she delved into soil, air, aquatic microbiome, the gut microbiome, and the concept of One Health.



## Department Of Botany

### National Workshop on Basics, Advances in Plant Taxonomy and Herbarium Techniques

Department of Botany, Government City College, in collaboration with the Botanical Survey of India (BSI), Kolkata, and DCR organized a two-day national workshop focused on the essentials and advancements in plant Taxonomy, as well as practical herbarium techniques, was conducted on 20th -21th September 2024. The workshop aimed to enhance participants' understanding and upgrading skills in critical areas of botany. The primary objectives of the workshop are to raise awareness about the fundamentals and advancements in plant taxonomy and to provide hands-on experience and knowledge in advanced herbarium techniques.

Dr. P. Harikrishna initiated the workshop with a presentation on the floristic diversity of India, highlighting endemic and threatened taxa from Telangana and Andhra Pradesh. Following him, Dr. L. Rasingam provided insights into the key concepts of the DSI and Its role in advancing technology, research, and conservation efforts in India. Dr. M. Sankar Rao led a hands-on training session on herbarium techniques, demonstrating essential practices such as pressing, mounting, poisoning, and arranging plant specimens. This was followed by a presentation from Dr. G. Swarnalatha, who discussed the diversity of lichen species and their representation in herbaria. Dr. C. Sudhakar Reddy presented on the advancement of taxonomy through technology, emphasizing the synergistic use of remote sensing in botanical research. Dr. J. 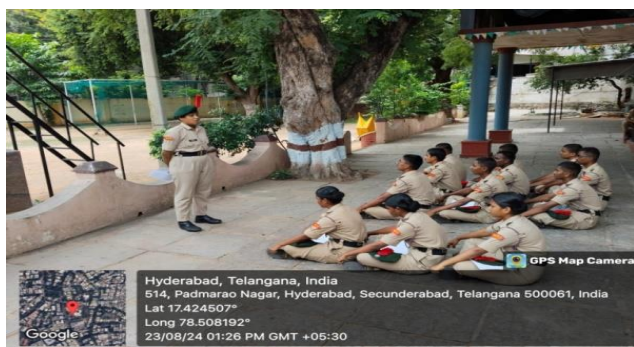
## Army Attachment 13 Dogra Reg

## National Sports Day 2024

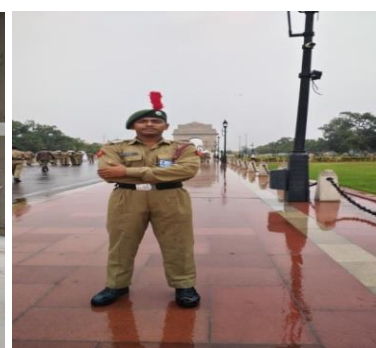
